The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional interest payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the underlyings. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the maturity date, unless terminated early. (Terms that appear in **bold** in this If, at maturity, the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** has fallen below its **barrier level**, the product may return less than the **product notional** amount or even zero.

Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the maturity date you will receive:

- if the final reference level of the worst performing underlying is at or above its barrier level, a cash payment equal to GBP 1,000.00; or
- if the final reference level of the worst performing underlying is below its barrier level, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the worst performing underlying. The cash payment will equal (i) the product notional amount multiplied by (ii) (A) the final reference level of the worst performing underlying divided by (B) its strike level.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlyings**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

When purchasing this product during its lifetime, the purchase price may include accrued interest on a pro rata basis.

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 7 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

To the extent the currency of the country in which you purchase this product or your account currency differs from the product currency, please be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Investment performance information

Main factors likely to affect future returns on the product

Your return on the product at the end of the recommended holding period will principally be affected by (1) the price at which you purchase the product, (2) the performance of the **underlyings** over the recommended holding period and of the exchange rate between the product currency and the underlying currencies and (3) the ability of the issuer to make payments that become due on the product. The value of the product before the **maturity date** or early termination of the product will also be affected by general economic and market conditions, the volatility of the **underlyings** (which is a measure of the extent of movement in the levels of the **underlyings**), interest rates, exchange rates, the correlation between the various **underlyings**, the remaining time to maturity and the ability of the issuer to make payments.

What could affect my return positively?

What could affect my return negatively?

- A decrease in the levels of the underlyings
- The occurrence of a barrier event
- Your overall return may be negatively affected if the product early terminates.

3. What happens if Morgan Stanley & Co. International plc is unable to pay out?

4. What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 7 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 14 January 2033 (maturity), although the product may terminate early.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. Save as otherwise disclosed in exit costs (see section "4. What are the costs?" above), no fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable.
